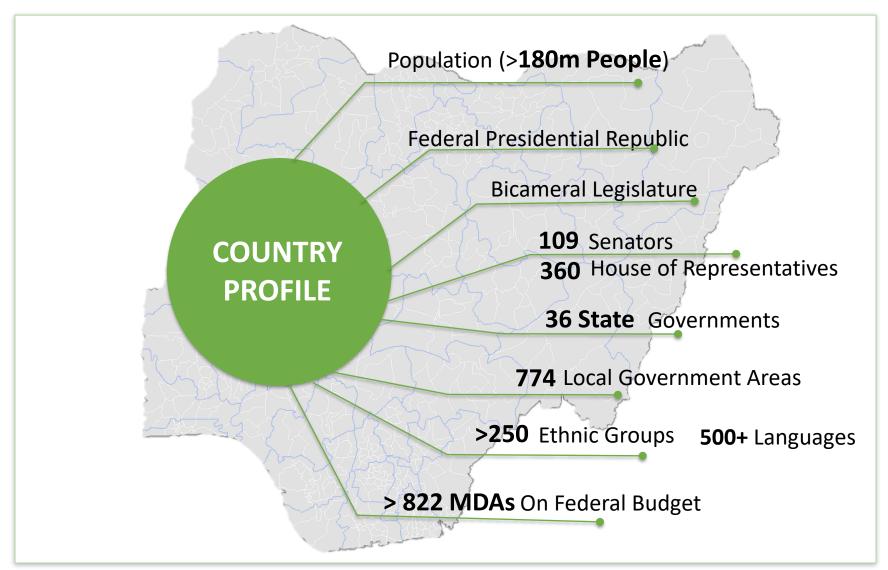

Using data to tell our story



Narrative

Nigeria has a significantly high infrastructure deficit which it is trying to bridge in recent times by allocating up to 30% of its budget to capital expenditure.

However, there are no justifications for some of the projects proposed by the Executive and most of the projects that are passed for implementation by the legislature. As a result implementation of the projects becomes challenging.

This undermines the ability of Government to meet its infrastructure development goals

ROLE OF THE LEGISLATURE IN APPROPRIATION

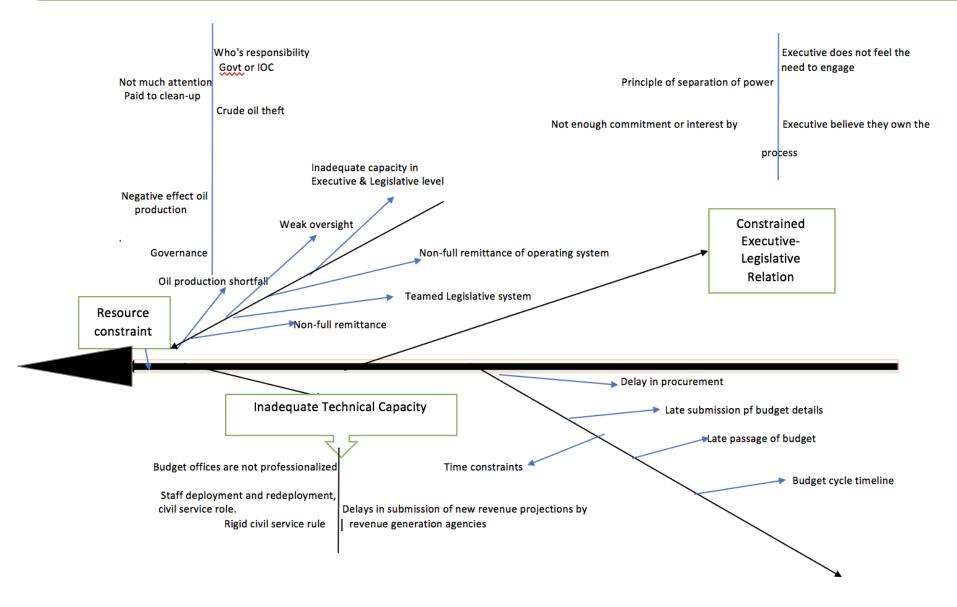
- Vested interest to have projects cited in their constituencies and zones.
- Limited knowledge of fiscal objectives and constraints.
- The desire to use-up their constitutional powers

TIME CONSTRAINT

- Delay in procurement process
- Late Passage of the Budget
- Late submission of the Budget
- Too many projects to be screened and implemented

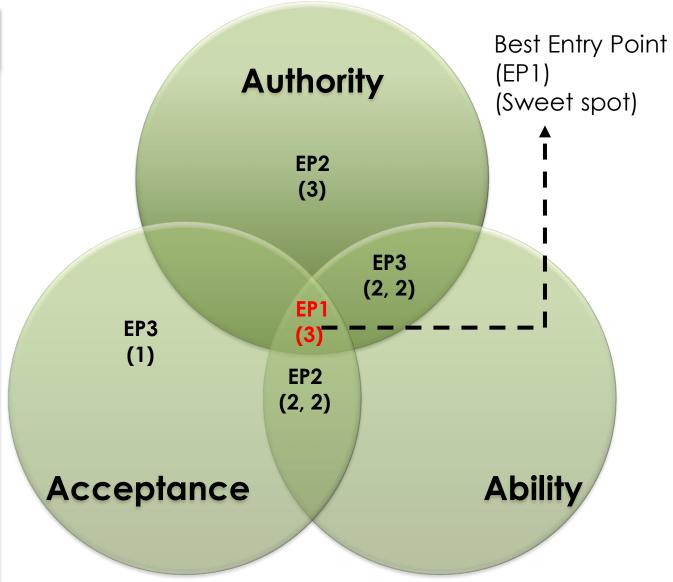

ENTRY POINT 1

Executive feel they own the process

Problem Solved

Robust prebudget engagement with legislature which will facilitate understanding & buy in, as well as significant reduction in the number of projects tampered with in the 2018 EBP

Output

- Executive Legislative prebudget bilateral meeting
- Periodic engagement with NASS leadership during preparation of the Budget details
- Speedy consideration and passage of the 2018-2020 MTFF (although with adjustment to the oil price benchmark)

ENTRY POINT 2

Unclear timelines / No strict adherence to budget calendar

Problem Solved

Clear and detailed budget timeline that facilitates early conclusion of the Medium Term Fiscal Framework (MTFF) and 2018 Appropriation Bill

Output

- Detailed budget calendar with clear timelines
- Timely conclusion of the 2018-2020 MTEF and approval by Federal Executive Council
- Submission of the 2018
 Appropriation Bill by 7th
 November (the earliest in many years)



ENTRY POINT 3

No proper coordination of budget training activities

Problem Solved

Increased capacity of budget officers within the MDAs and Budget Office

Output

- Minimal errors in MDAs budget submission
- MDAs submitted their 2018 budget online using GIFMIS this facilitated budget ownership by MDAs
- Well-screened and selected capital projects in the 2018 Appropriation Bill
- Time saving: no time to lose in uploading budget on GIFMIS, and budget analysis will be much easier and faster



LESSONS LEARNED



LESSONS LEARNED

- Political capital is very important in achieving key objectives in the programme
- Periodic team meetings helps keep the team focused on the goal
- PDIA provides a simpler and better methodological approach to understanding problems and providing solutions
- Better executive-legislative synergy produces better results
- "If you want to go fast go alone, if you want to go far go together".

NEXT STEPS

- Conduct a post-mortem on some of the key activities especially on the capacity building exercise so as to improve in the coming year
- Deepen engagements between the Executive and Legislature at lower levels
- Continued engagement with the parliament as they consider the Budget proposal
- Review the 2018 Appropriation Act when passed to identifying changes. This will determine if we achieved the objective of reducing the number of infractions in the Budget proposal
- Create teams and mentor on the PDIA to help resolve other PFM related issues

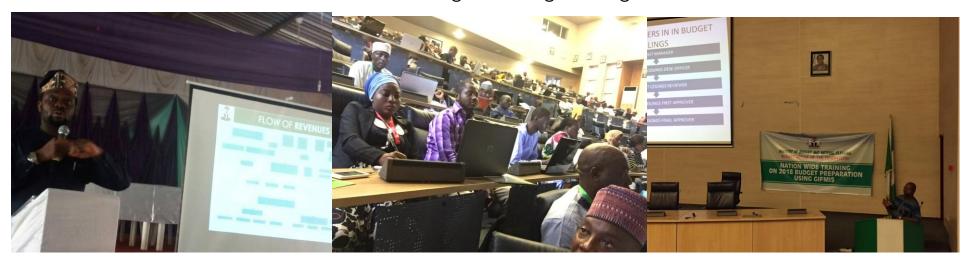
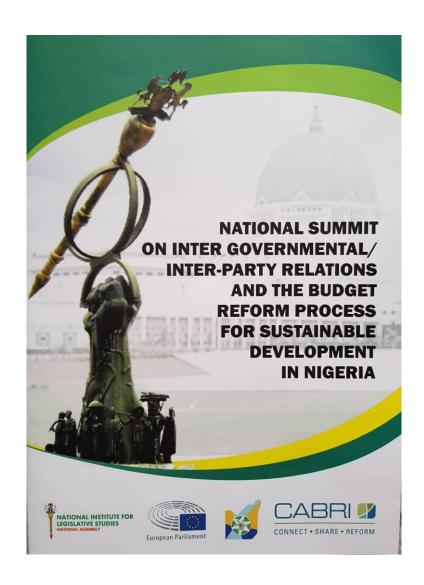
