
Maintaining Nutrition as a priority during COVID-19

Nutrition included in the Socio-Economic Impact (monitoring & analysis) of COVID-19 and its implications on the SADC Region.

Recommendations: Continuity of essential nutrition services for children and women of reproductive age.

- Advocacy for inclusion of nutrition in the national COVID-19 Response plans FNS Bulletin released in April 2020.
- Repurposing of Nutrition budgets to support remote monitoring of Food and Nutrition Security.
- **Education Sector:** School meals programme amplified as one of the key safety nets targeting school aged children during COVID-19

Impacts of the pandemic in the fisheries sector has been the disrupted supply chain, *market* access or *logistical problems* related to transportation and border restrictions.

- Impact analysis with recommendations across the value chain of fisheries & Aquaculture – endorsed by the Ministers in May 2020
- Resource mobilisation: SADC in discussion with AfDB on financing mechanisms to support Member States
- Advocacy through Regional platforms with partners and series of webinars; as well as development of policy briefs for dissemination
- Capacity building for MSs through online & virtual workshops
- Strengthening the SADC Regional Fisheries Monitoring, Control and Surveillance
- Development of best practices for small-scale fisheries, including building resilience to survive impacts of climate change, COVID-19 etc.
- SADC Sec is profiling the regional aquaculture value chains- currently with the aim of developing a business case (Webinar Series 10, 17 & 24 July to review the study report)
